“These things”.... the men articulated the very things that put them in chaos and confusion and here Jesus was going to tell that, that those very things are the very things proving that Jesus is the Messiah.

Genesis: The Promise: Genesis 3:15 Messiah will be the seed of a woman, and Satan, that enemy of God will bruise the heel of the Messiah, but the Messiah will bruise your head.

The Messiah is the sacrifice of the son on Mount Moriah, not the ram that God provided Abraham, but the Lamb, provided by God Himself.

Exodus: The Messiah heard the cry if His people in Exodus 3 and He Himself came delivered you. He Himself, the Messiah, is the promised Passover lamb. The lambs were killed, their blood painted on posts.

Atonement always requires blood. SO Messiah, God with skin on, would provide that blood.

As the bronze snake was lifted up in the wilderness and healed all who looked upon it, so the Messiah was lifted up likewise on a cross. Looking to the Messiah will save any who desire.

Deuteronomy: Chapter 18:15-18, God promises to send another Prophet like Moses. You yourself said, that Jesus was a great Prophet mighty in deed and word.

Joshua: The Messiah is the captain of salvation, the deliverer, the One who even redeems the harlot, with a scarlet cord.

- The Messiah will be loathed by men
- The Messiah will be bound
- The Messiah will bear the anger of God

- The Messiah will be acquainted with deep darkness
- The Messiah will be sneered at
- The Messiah will be despised
- The Messiah will have all his bones out of joint
- The Messiah will have his heart like wax, it will run out like water
- The Messiah will be encircled by evil doers
- The Messiah will have his garments divided and lots cast for them
- The Messiah will be one who calls upon God daily and has spread out His hands to do the will of God not his own
- The Messiah will have the lovingkindness of God Himself declared in the grave
- The Messiah will be the pronouncement of the faithfulness of God even in abandonment

Proverbs: The Messiah is wisdom none can compare.

Ecclesiastes: The Messiah is the time and season of redemption, the meaning within the madness.

Song of Solomon: The Messiah is the lover of our souls, our bridegroom who has waited eternity for us.

Isaiah: The Messiah is the lamb who was led to slaughter without a word. The Messiah will be wounded for our iniquity and bruised for our transgressions. The wrath of God will be upon Him in spite of His name being Wonderful Counselor almighty God everlasting Father and Prince of peace. The Messiah will set the captive free and restore sight to the blind.

Zephaniah: The Messiah will be king of the Jews... on the cross that was the label above His head.
